Sir,

As you are doubtless aware, the application of Albania for admission to the League of Nations will come before the First Assembly, which will be opened at Geneva on the 15th November.

I feel sure that the Assembly will find it desirable to have at its disposal for the consideration of this application full information regarding the status of Albania.

For this purpose, I should be very glad to be in a position to place before the Assembly:-

1. An authentic copy of the documents by which Albania has declared its independence or by which it has been acceded full self government, together with any subsequent confirmatory documents.
2. Authentic copies of the Declarations by which other Governments have recognised the Government of Albania as a de facto or a de jure Government.

I should, therefore, be much obliged if the Government of Albania would be good enough to furnish me with a complete set of such documents.

Should the documents be in any language other than French or English, I should be grateful if it were possible to add authentic translations.
